

3-D SNOWMAN

You can make a 3-D snowman. Choose one of the following methods to build your snowman, then use your own ideas and ideas from the bottom of the page to decorate your snowman.

COTTON BALL SNOWMAN

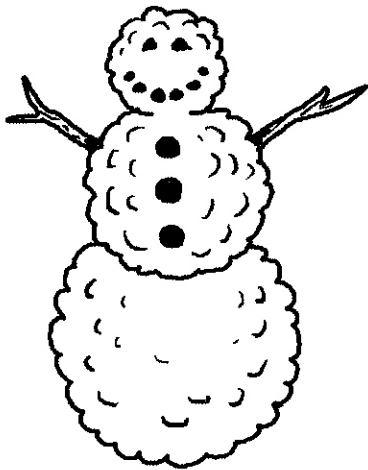
1. Get three large white cotton balls and cut them to look like three different sizes: head, middle and bottom.
2. Glue the cotton balls to each other with the smallest at the top and the largest on the bottom.



KRISPIE SNOWMAN

(Get an adult to help you. The number of snowmen you will get from this recipe depends on the size of the snowmen.)

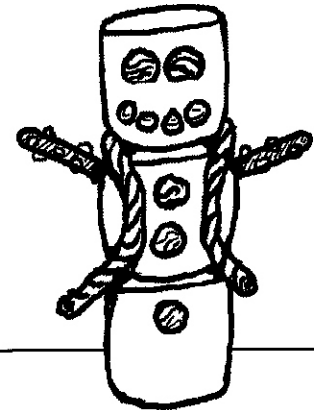
1. Melt 1/4 cup of butter in a large pot on the stove.
2. Add 10 ounces of marshmallows, stirring until melted
3. Remove the pot from the heat.
4. Add 5 cups of Krispie cereal and stir until it is coated.
5. Put margarine on your hands and divide the mixture into balls for the snowman
6. For each snowman, stack three balls with the smallest ball on the top.
7. If you plan to eat this snowman, use chocolate chips or raisins for eyes and buttons, candy corn for a nose and a Fruit Roll-Up® for the scarf. If you do not plan to eat the snowman, use the decorating ideas below.



*note: Optional - Roll the balls in coconut while still warm.

MARSHMALLOW SNOWMAN

1. Get three large marshmallows.
2. Run a pipe cleaner or piece of a drinking straw through the middle to stack them three marshmallows high.
3. If you plan to eat this snowman, use white frosting to glue edible features such as chocolate chip eyes, etc. If you do not plan to eat the snowman, use the decorating ideas below.



DECORATING IDEAS

- Arms: Use tree sticks, craft sticks, pipe cleaners, straws, pretzels, etc.
- Eyes
- Nose
- Mouth
- Buttons
- Scarf: Use ribbon, a cloth strip, a strip of Fruit Roll-Up®, crepe paper, licorice strip, etc.
- Hat: Use Necco® candy disk with a film canister, toe from a baby's sock, pill cup, bottle cap, etc.
